Designing the Joint Training Courses and Its Operation Mechanism for On-site Visitors of Higher Education Evaluation Associations in Taiwan

The main purpose of this study is to probe whether diversification of institutional evaluation in Taiwan is feasible or not. The primary benchmarking strategies is to analyze the classification of universities and evaluations modes in major countries. Therefore, this research examines the diversified theoretical bases of evaluation, higher education classification systems and diverse institutional evaluation systems. The comprehensive comparison of university types and evaluation agencies were carried out while opinions of experts and scholars on this wider topic were also collected. 1. Consider to consolidate the respectively institutional evaluations of general and technological universities as one;

2. Reflect upon the current evaluation purposes and indictors as so to be in line with the balanced notions among institutional improvement, policy-guidance, and social accountability;

3. Diversify the components of institutional evaluators;

4. Allow institutions to choose or set up their indicators on the basis of selfpositioning and specialization;

5. Evaluation results and reports can be more flexible and diverse.
