INQAAHE Funding Scheme Capacity Building 2018: Comparisons of QA systems, Review standards and Procedures, and Transparency in Taiwan and Indonesia: Capacity Building for Mutual Recognition at Joint/Dual Programs

ABSTRACT

Cross-border higher education resulting in the increased mobility of students, academic staff, programs, institutions, and professionals has grown considerably in global times. Therefore, how to ensure that the quality of programs has met the local and international standards simultaneously has become a great challenge in many nations.

Based on the mentioned above, Taiwan and Indonesian QA agencies, Higher Education Evaluation and Accreditation Council of Taiwan (HEEACT) and National Accreditation Agency for Higher Education (BAN-PT) completed a comparative study by document sharing and workshops holding in order to build trust and understanding on each other's Higher education (HE) and QA systems. Furthermore, to develop a Transnational Education joint monitoring model to promote student mobility.

Over past 8 months, there are several major outcomes and findings in the capacity building project, including

- (1) 5 HEEACT working group meetings, 4 skype meeting between HEEACT and BAN-PT, and three workshops were held, which engage more than 150 participants from QA agencies, governments and universities.
- (2) A comparative analysis on the QA system, review procedures and standards of both the agencies was complete
- (3) A joint Monitoring Manuel on the joint and dual degree programs of Taiwan and Indonesia was complete
- (4) An observation report on the implementation and quality review has been developed by ECA consultants
